Primary care providers (PCPs) are responsible for almost half of all opioid prescriptions written in the US. A recent study found that primary care NPs and PAs wrote more opioid prescriptions than their physician colleagues. However, limited time, training, and access to resources often make it difficult for these clinicians to effectively evaluate their patients presenting with pain and choose a treatment that best fits each patient's needs.
